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OVERVIEW

CORE is designed to highlight the foundational truths of the Bible, which will position you to grow in your relationship with our heavenly Father, and equip you to be the world-changer He has called each of us to be.

By asking Jesus to be Lord of your life, and receiving His presence in the person of the Holy Spirit, you not only have an assurance of your eternal destination but have also been equipped to now live an overcoming life. Living daily in Christ's overcoming power comes about through developing an intimate relationship with the Lord and a greater knowledge of His word. This is what Jesus referred to as being a disciple (learner or follower). A few of the essential ingredients to the life of a disciple of Jesus Christ are:

- Daily reading, meditation and application of Bible scriptures.
- Prayer & Worship (talking & listening to God while resting in His presence.
- Commit to a welcoming local church family that teaches from the Bible and values God's presence.
- Sharing with others what God has done in your life

It is essential to grasp the importance of these principles from the outset and to begin establishing them as a part of your life.

1. SALVATION

Because humanity cannot overcome sin on its own, God came to earth in the person of Jesus. Living free from sin, Jesus became the perfect sacrifice for the sins of mankind once and for all. The Greek word for salvation is *sozo* which means to save, deliver, protect, heal, preserve, or to make whole. Salvation is a free gift from God provided through Jesus. There is nothing anyone can do in their own strength to save themselves from sin and death.

5. THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the trinity (1John5:7) and similarly existed from the beginning of time (Genesis 1:2). Following Jesus' resurrection, the Holy Spirit came to His followers and filled them with the same presence and power of God that He had. The Bible refers to Him as the "Advocate" or Helper, which in the original Greek means: one called alongside, counselor, comforter and encourager. The Holy Spirit inside you is the equivalent of having Jesus with you every day, and He will never leave you.

Still another person is given the ability to speak in unknown languages, while another is given the ability to interpret what is being said. ¹¹ It is the one and only Spirit who distributes all these gifts. The word baptism comes from the Greek word *baptizo*, which means to immerse or to go under. Baptism is an outward expression of what has taken place on the inside of a person who has committed their life to Christ. Just as Jesus died and was buried, your sinful past is dead and buried as you go into the water, and just as Jesus resurrected, you rise up out of the water in newness of life!

For the disciples to continue the mission of Jesus on earth, they would need power beyond their natural abilities. The same is true for us today. We can confess Jesus as Lord and receive His Holy Spirit into our lives and live eternally with Him, but until we are baptized (immersed) with the Holy Spirit, we won't be able to function in the same power as Jesus while here on earth.

From Peter to Stephen to Saul, we read of the dramatic impact in their lives as a result of being baptized in the Holy Spirit. When you ask God to fill you with His Spirit, you can expect a tangible experience, but also know it is different for everyone. Here are some of the manifestations in scripture when one is baptized with the Holy Spirit:

Boldness to share Jesus with others (Acts 4:13, 4:31)

Speak in other languages and prophesy (Acts 2:4, 19:1-7)

Spontaneous praise to God (Acts 10:45-46)

Miracles flowing through us to others (Acts 8:13, 14:3)

Supernatural insight on scripture (Acts 4:13, Matthew 10:18-20)

Ideally, every Believer would receive the infilling of the Holy Spirit at conversion, but this is not always the case (as we find throughout the book of Acts). Oftentimes people are not aware they can receive this infilling simultaneously at conversion. Either way, it is available as a free gift to any that would ask.
